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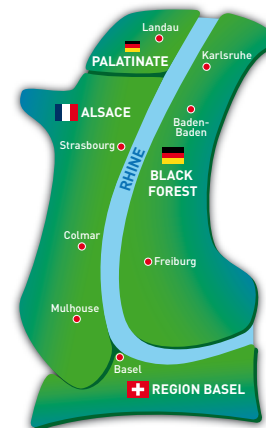
Feel good with us in the Upper Rhine!

Alsace is the smallest region in France. It consists of just two départements, namely Haut-Rhin and Bas-Rhin. It is easy to find your feet here because Alsatians are so friendly and enjoy speaking to visitors who are looking for directions or ask where to

find the best restaurants. The region measures just 190 km from north to south and 50 km from west to east. It lies in the idyllic area between the Rhine and the Vosges. Just a stone's throw away from Germany and Switzerland, whether for a day trip, or one-week hiking trip or holiday, Alsace is an ideal destination.

Multiculturalism in the countryside



The region around Basel is unique in Europe: a multicultural population on the border between France and Germany makes the region unmistakable, cosmopolitan, cheerful and innovative. You will be enthralled!

Within a stone's throw of the pulsing city of Basel, Baselland surprises with its scenic beauty, cultural variety and many insiders' tips. The fog-free autumn and winter days are legendary; the view of the Alps and surrounding countryside is breath-taking. Augusta Raurica is the largest Roman settlement north of the Alps: the temples, amphitheatre and arena are two thousand years old.

Legendary Swiss quality is not limited to watches and knives. It is also demonstrated in the perfect network of paths. You'll never get lost here: the hiking trails through the mountains of Jura,

covering thousands of kilometres, are perfectly signposted. Many lead to the small medieval town of St. Ursanne at the river Doubs, the lifeline of the Jura: a small river for fishing, bathing and strolling. On foot or by bike, it takes you through magical landscape. You can find local customs and tradition in the Freiberger Mountains, a gently undulating plateau with pine forests, extensive pastures and sturdy farms and studs. The famous Freiberger horses are bred here.

Aargau is also richly blessed with beautiful, untouched nature and countryside. Everyone, whether they are a nature lover, culture lover, art enthusiast, sportsperson, bon vivant or a family should take a trip of discovery in this region.

Black forest

Traditionally hospitable



Cuckoo clocks, Bollenhut hats, Black Forest farms and Black Forest gateau – the Black Forest is the epitome of a homely German holiday resort. But it is also a landscape of modern industry and culture, a huge recreational area, and a Mecca for outdoor

enthusiasts.

The Black Forest, which ascends from the south to the 1493 metre high Feldberg, is the highest of the German low mountain ranges and also the most diverse. More than 24,000 of excellently signposted hiking trails, various cycling trails and exceptional snow sports conditions await you in the Black Forest.

Sunny vineyards and acres of fertile land alternate with mountain pastures and moors, extensive forest-covered mountains with treeless hilltops and jagged gorges with wide valleys. And in between lie 320 villages, towns and small

towns, as well as wildlife parks, theme parks and family resorts, particularly Europa-Park in Rust, which is the German counterpart to Disneyworld.

Thanks to the diverse countryside, cuisine, wine, beer and water, the region is the «greatest area for connoisseurs in Germany». Gourmet guidebooks currently award so many Michelin stars, gourmet points, crests, diamonds and spoons in the region that statistically there is at least one culinary highlight in every village.

However, there are also more thermal baths and spa hotels, therapeutic baths and health resorts here than in any other comparable region far and wide. «Wellness Stars» even guarantee TÜV-tested quality.

Southern Palatinate

Variety in living culture



What would the Southern Palatinate be without wine? It shapes the image of the landscape and plays a significant role in the cultural and economic variety of the region in the Upper Rhine Valley. People have cultivated the left banks of the

Rhine as far back as in Roman times. Over the centuries, traditional wine-growing families have used their diligence and innovation to establish an excellent reputation for their Pfälzer Wein all over the world.

Hiking in the Palatinate Forest is a special experience. You can go from soft sandy paths through dense mixed woodland, encountering cliffs and ruins but always have a view on the soft hills of the wine-growing area or the endless humps of the Palatinate Forest. Hike a few days on the Pfälzer Weinsteig or along the German Wine Route. Here you are never far from the next Palatinate Forest hut, a genuine wine bar or village economy.

You are spoilt for choice in Southern Palatinate: so many medieval castles, fortresses, churches and festivals take place within such a small area. The castles, forts and fort ruins are a real treat. From the Burg Landeck you have a wonderful view across as far as the Black Forest. For a long time, Germersheim was a heavily reinforced border fortress. A tour through the underground passageways is unforgettable. Experiences that the whole family can enjoy include a boat trip on the Lusoria Rhenana, the faithful reproduction of a Roman warship; the FunForest in Kandel; the South Palatinate handcar railway, the animal and nature park in Silz or the zoo in the pretty little town of Landau.

Cities Basel

The artists' city



Cosmopolitan, international, innovative – and solid Swiss quality everywhere. The heart of the city is the old town of Basel. With its lovingly maintained and modernised houses and squares, it is one of the best-preserved old towns in Europe. Basel cherishes tradition – Morgestraich, a breathtaking night-time ritual with pipes and drums that takes place in complete darkness at 4 o'clock in the morning, has been celebrated on the Monday after Ash Wednesday since 1835. At the same time, the city is a showcase for the best modern architecture: Mario Botta, Herzog & de Meuron or Renzo Piano have all designed spectacular modern buildings here.

Basel is appealing in both, the summer and the winter, with traditional festivals, art exhibitions, dance theatre, concerts, plays and operas. As the leading city in Switzerland for fairs, the city organises the Art Basel fair, a must for gallery owners and buyers from all over the world. The watch and jewellery festival, Baselworld, serves a particularly discerning public.

Around 40 museums have made Basel the international art metropolis. The private collection at the Fondation Beyeler represents works of modern classicism, while Museum Tinguely exhibits funny, noisy automatic machines and bizarre mechanics. The Kunstmuseum Basel is home to Renaissance masterpieces of the 19th and early 20th century.

The Rhine is a landmark of the city: as an important transport route, the river has contributed to the development of the city for two thousand years. Apart from goods, it brings guests from all over the world, plus a high standard of living: sun-drenched banks, romantic streets, cafes and bistros invite you to take a stroll and while away the time.

The comfortable city



Located in a picturesque setting and even more attractive thanks to its proximity to the prettiest wine villages in Alsace, Colmar delights every visitor. Close to Basel and Strasbourg, situated on the Vosges and the Rhine, Colmar has all the best that that Alsace has to offer. Art and history are incomparable here, and the atmosphere is very relaxed. Shaped by its glamorous past in the Middle Ages and the Early Modern era, the city has been able to maintain its rich architectural heritage, together with the good human spirit of the city and friendly cooperation of its people.

Did you know that Auguste Bartholdi, sculptor and inventor of the Statue of Liberty in New York, came from Colmar? For the culture enthusiasts among you, Colmar boasts several museums, such as the Unterlinden Museum with the Isenheim Altarpiece; the Bartholdi Museum and the Spielzeugmuseum (toy museum). Colmar is famous for

having retained its unique historic city centre. Wandering through the pedestrianized streets and over bridges adorned with flowers allows you to soak up the special atmosphere that makes Colmar a true living museum.

The Green City



Sun-drenched and embedded in the green foothills of the Black Forest, Freiburg offers visitors southern flair and a positive attitude to life. The historic old town centre is the vibrant centre of the city. Here, locals and guests alike can enjoy Baden cuisine and friendly hospitality with a glass of Pinot Blanco, preferably in the street cafes and beer gardens. Many also admire the Bächle, tiny brooks that wind through the streets and alleys. Dipping your feet in the brooks on hot summer days is a service that only Freiburg can offer.

Landmarks of the city include Freiburg Cathedral, whose spire is a masterpiece of Gothic architecture. Visitors can discover the secret alleys and century-old houses around the cathedral and the cathedral square, which form a picturesque backdrop

to the colourful weekly market. Visitors can reach the castle hill in three minutes on the funicular and from there they can enjoy incredible views over the city and the Rhine Valley.

With its ambitious environmental policy and a political and public awareness of renewable energy sources, the Green City of Freiburg has made a name for itself internationally.

Cultural highlights on the stage and in the open air, concerts, carnival and the autumn wine festivals attract many visitors from all over the world to Freiburg all year round. Freiburg: the gateway to the Black Forest, and the most southern and sunny metropolis in Germany.

The media city



A city for people interested in culture, gourmets and families. Karlsruhe obtained its «fan-shaped» cityscape from city founder Margrave Karl Wilhelm, who in 1715 built his palace as the centre, with 32 streets stemming out from it like beams.

With more than 800 hectares of open parks and green areas, the number of individual parcels of land for peace and recreation in Karlsruhe are unique in Germany. The botanic garden, palace garden and zoological garden alone are worth a visit.

Street cafes, beer gardens and squares invite you to unwind and relax. Baden's longest shopping street, Kaiserstraße, and the largest indoor shopping centre in southern Germany, Ettlinger Tor, ensure sheer shopping enjoyment.

The symbol of the city is situated in the market square: the pyramid that marks the grave of the city founder. The Via Triumphalis, with its unique collection of classical buildings, begins here and leads to the palace. The world-unique,

interactive ZKM Centre for Art and Media Technology, Germany's answer to the Pompidou centre, is a special experience that the whole family can enjoy.

In addition, the city has other noteworthy museums and collections, such as the Museum of Contemporary Art, the Baden State Museum in the palace or the State Art Gallery. And of course, Karlsruhe also offers superb dining: Baden cuisine is world-renowned.

The view over the district of Durlach from the local mountain, the Turmberg, is magnificent. You can get up the mountain on the Turmbergbahn, the oldest funicular railway in Germany. From it you can see the Black Forest, but also the picturesque market square and the narrow alleys of the old town.

The car and textile printing city



Ideally located between the Rhine river and the Vosges mountains, Mulhouse is an insiders' tip: the city will surprise you! Mulhouse has the charm of Alsace and with its fast transportation links tourists have the opportunity to quickly visit neighbouring Switzerland and Germany.

Mulhouse draws on a unique past and an industrial heritage from the 18th and 19th century. These testimonies of a technologically and technically vast history are showcased in unique museums, which attract visitors from all over the world: the textile printing museum, automobile museum, wallpaper museum and train museum are unique collections that are only found in Mulhouse. However, the city has other cards to play: for a number of years, the city has been a centre for modern art. There is a Center for contemporary art, art college and a European biennial for young, aspiring artists.

You can go out and enjoy yourself in this cosmopolitan city. Numerous festivals take place throughout the year.

Mulhouse is a great place for shopping and wandering: international chains, small independent shops, long-established specialist shops or modern boutiques. But there is also a lot of tradition: in many inns, known locally as winstubs, you can enjoy a glass of wine and beer with a slice of Flammkuchen – or snails, frogs' legs, goose liver...

Take Mulhouse as your starting destination for discovering Alsace and the Black Forest. Take a museum tour to Basel, sample the regional specialities: simply let yourself be surprised!

Strasbourg

The European City



Strasbourg's "Grande-Ile", was the first city centre in France to be placed on UNESCO's World Heritage list in 1988.

After the Second World War, Strasbourg naturally became a European city – in 1949, the Council of Europe (currently with 47 members) adopted it as its seat. Other important European institutions such as the European Parliament and the European Court of Human Rights also settled in Strasbourg and are located in the European institutions quarter.

Despite the War, Strasbourg was able to protect an exceptionally wide range of cultural possessions, which are testimony to the development of the city from Roman times to this very day.

The cathedral, which was described as a "prodigy of the gigantic and the delicate" by Victor Hugo, can be seen for miles around. With its 142-metre high spire, it was the highest edifice in Christendom right up to the 19th century!

La Petite France, one of the most picturesque quarters, which was once home to tanners, fishermen and millers, is a peaceful area in the heart of the city.



You also must visit the ten renowned museums and the "Imperial German Quarter", which was partly created in the typical Wilhelminian style after the French defeat of 1870 and the annexation of Alsace to the German Empire.

A range of restaurants brings the cityscape to life, including fine dining restaurants, which are among the best in France. You can enjoy local specialities in the small inns or "winstubs" that are typical in Strasbourg. Don't forget the Alsatian wines – Gewürztraminer, Muscat, Pinot Blanc, Pinot Gris, Pinot Noir, Riesling, Sylvaner.

The extensive pedestrian zones, the tranquillity of the canals, the distinctive quarters of the city, the numerous parks and green areas – all these make Strasbourg an experience by foot, boat, mini tram or bike!

Strasbourg is a warm-hearted, authentic city that has managed to be both modern and traditional at the same time.

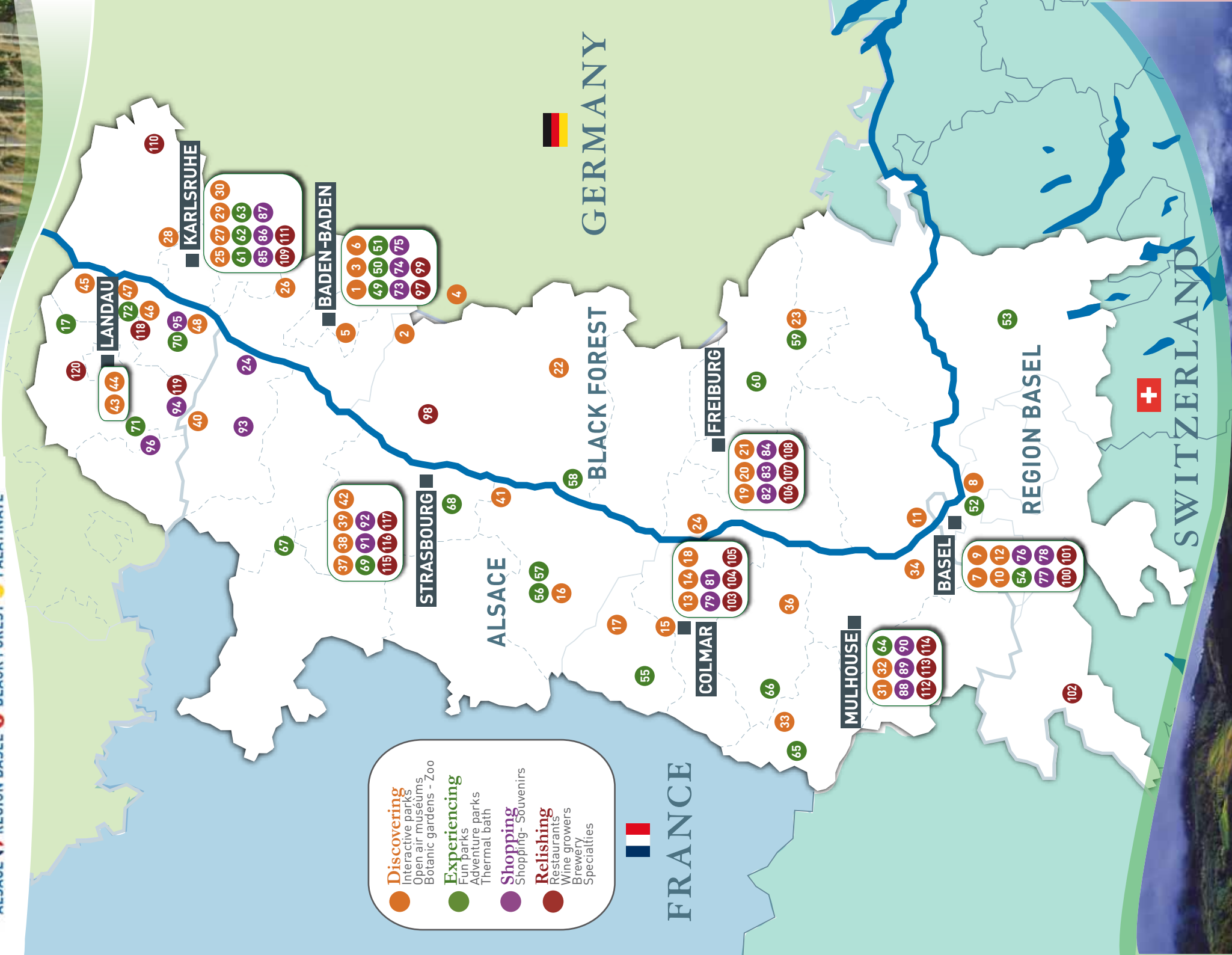
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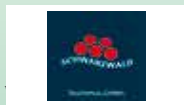


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
